Useful vocabulary

Fairly last-minute trip

A holiday organised at short notice.

Take time off work

Ask for leave from work in order to do something like take a holiday.

Head over (somewhere)

An informal expression meaning to go somewhere.

Surreal experience

A bizarre and strange experience.

Tag along

To follow someone (especially someone who is leading you).

"Anyway, Monica invited her boyfriend and me to tag along."

Touch down

An informal phrasal verb meaning to arrive (usually by plane).

"The first thing I did as soon as I **touched down** in Bali was to rent a small scooter for travelling around the island."

Curse myself

Say rude words to yourself in anger.

"I cursed myself for not having checked."

Rent out

A phrasal verb meaning to rent (usually used for short term flat rentals).

"I felt totally relieved when I finally reached the Airbnb that my friends and I had **rented out**."

Stunning

Very beautiful.

"It was a **stunning** little apartment that was super close to the sea."
