

Can you describe a typical working day?

Well, **as an** online teacher, I work from home most of the time. I **tend to** wake up around 7:30, and I'll **often** try to do some exercise before I start work. I start work at 09:00 every day and I **usually** begin by checking emails and making my to-do list with all the tasks I need to do that day. **Most days**, I'll either be planning or filming video lessons, so that **takes up the bulk of my time**. I try to finish by 17:00 each day, and after that, I'll **generally** try to get out of the house for a walk or to do some exercise.

Useful vocabulary**Present simple / Will + infinitive**

You can use either to express present habits and routines.

*"I **often start** work at 09:00."*

*"I'll **often start** work at 09:00."*

Most of the time/ tend to/ often/ usually/ most days/ generally

You can use these to explain how often you do something.

*"Well, **as an online teacher**, I work from home **most of the time**."*

*"I **tend to** wake up around 7:30, and I'll **often** try to do some exercise before I start work."*

*"After that, I'll **generally** try to get out of the house for a walk or to do some exercise."*

As a/an (job), I (verb phrase)

*"**As a nurse**, I spend a lot of time attending to my patients' needs."*

*"**As a software engineer**, I spend the majority of my time in front of a computer."*

*"**As an architect**, I often have to work long hours."*

Take up the bulk of time

A particular activity/task consumes or occupies most of one's time, implying that this activity is the primary/dominant use of one's time, leaving less time available for other activities.

*"Doing the housework **takes up the bulk of my time**."*
