Useful expressions**Compared to + noun/verb phrase**

Used to highlight a difference or similarity between two things.

*"**Compared to** a lot of my friends or my mum, I eat barely any."*

Every so often

Occasionally or at irregular intervals.

*"But I do enjoy dark chocolate **every so often**."*

Crave

An intense desire for something.

*"I never really **crave** chocolate."*

Devour

Consume something quickly and eagerly.

*"When I do eat chocolate, I can't stop **devouring** it until it's all finished."*

To never have been a big fan of something

This means that someone has never particularly liked or been enthusiastic about a specific thing, activity, or person.

*"I've **never been a fan of** eating chocolate."*

To refrain from something

To deliberately avoid doing something or to stop yourself from engaging in a particular action or behaviour.

*"I try to **refrain from** eating too much chocolate."*

Tend to

Used to describe a common or habitual action, behaviour, or inclination.

*"I **tend to** eat chocolate when I'm watching movies."*

2nd Conditional

Used to express hypothetical situations

*"If I **were** to stop eating chocolate, I **would be** very sad."*

Can never get enough

An idiomatic expression used to describe someone's strong desire or love for something

*"I **can never get enough** dark chocolate. I love it!"*
