Useful expressions

Compared to + noun/verb phrase

Used to highlight a difference or similarity between two things.

"Compared to a lot of my friends or my mum, I eat barely any."

Every so often

Occasionally or at irregular intervals.

"But I do enjoy dark chocolate every so often."

Crave

An intense desire for something.

"I never really **crave** chocolate."

Devour

Consume something quickly and eagerly.

"When I do eat chocolate, I can't stop **devouring** it until it's all finished."

To never have been a big fan of something

This means that someone has never particularly liked or been enthusiastic about a specific thing, activity, or person.

"I've never been a fan of eating chocolate."

To refrain from something

To deliberately avoid doing something or to stop yourself from engaging in a particular action or behaviour.

"I try to **refrain from** eating too much chocolate."

Tend to

Used to describe a common or habitual action, behaviour, or inclination.

"I **tend to** eat chocolate when I'm watching movies."

2nd Conditional

Used to express hypothetical situations

"If I were to stop eating chocolate, I would be very sad."

Can never get enough

An idiomatic expression used to describe someone's strong desire or love for something "I can never get enough dark chocolate. I love it!"
